



Meeting minutes scanned onto computer disks

BOY RIVER - Cass County administrator's office has been scanning onto computer disks all the county commissioner meeting minutes back to February 1889.

Records from April 1938 through the present have been completed. Those original minute books permitted removing pages for scanning, then reinserting them without damaging pages.

Earlier records books had pages sewn into the binding. Tuesday, the county board approved purchasing new binders for the older books. Each new book bind with retainer pegs costs \$100.

The board approved hiring temporary help in the county attorney's office, recorder's office and income maintenance division of social services as well as a part-time home health aide. The county has a hiring freeze on replacing any full-time permanent employees.

Cass County Economic Development Corp. reported Director Gail Levenson worked with 28 businesses in April, which could bring a potential 215.5 new jobs to the county and involve \$69.5 million in capital investment.

Of those, 22 would be new developments. Ten each would be services or manufacturing, while seven are retail and one is a nonprofit.
